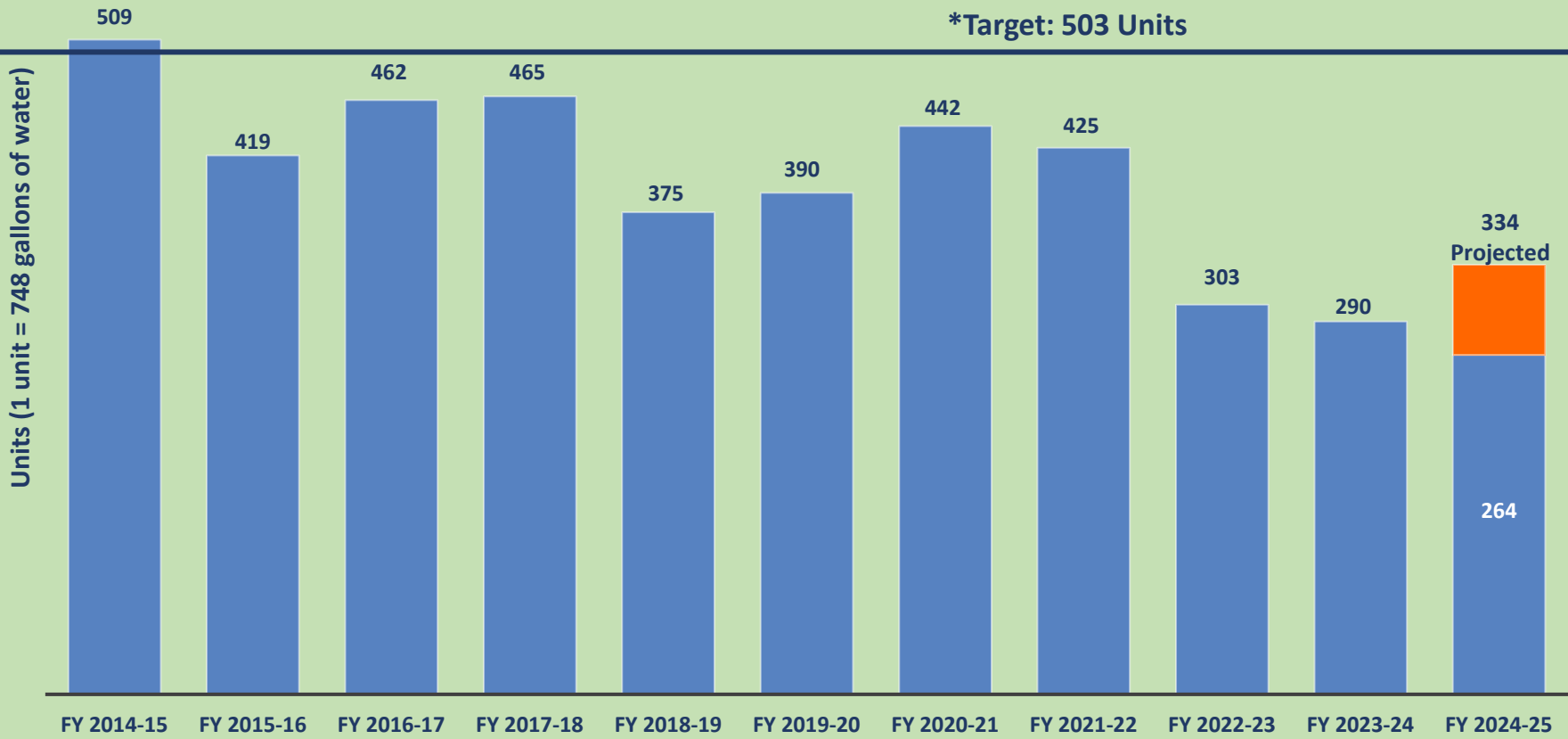

Water Usage Per Acre (All Funds)



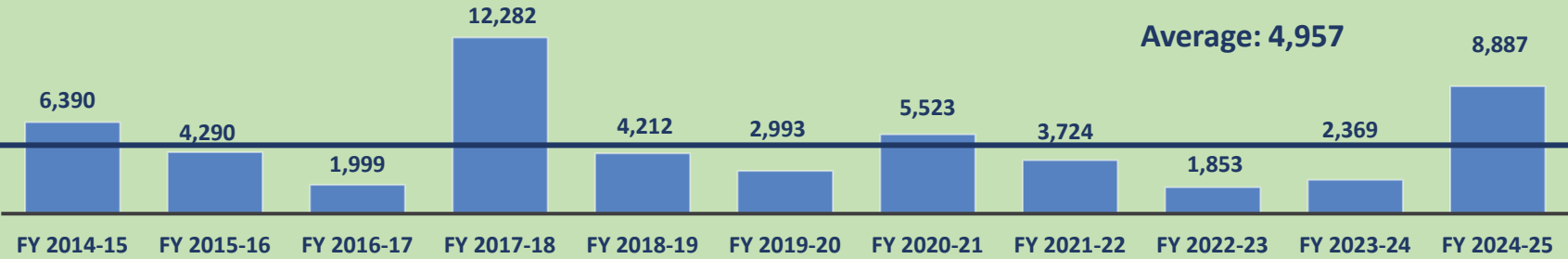

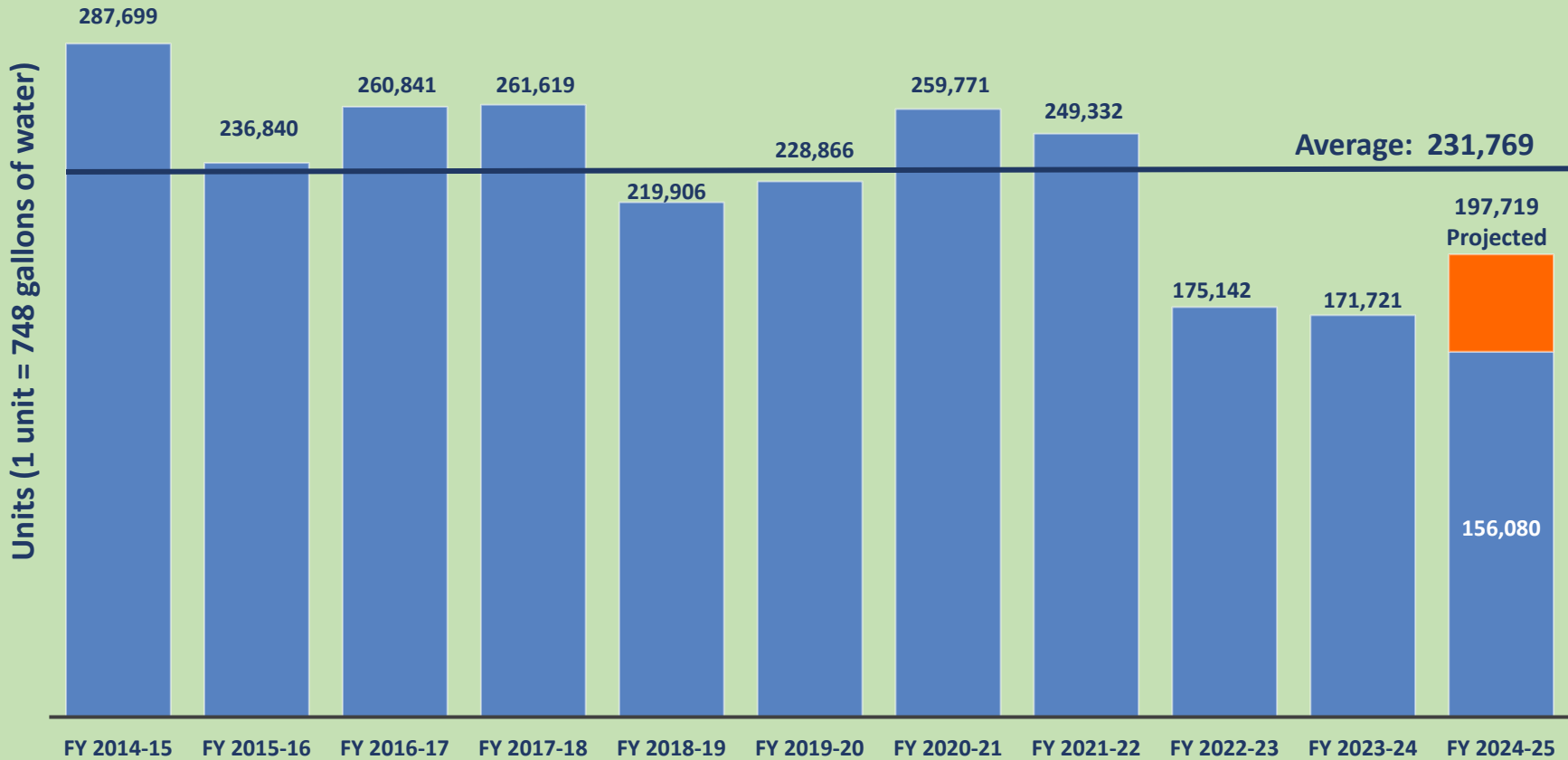
Historical Water Usage for January

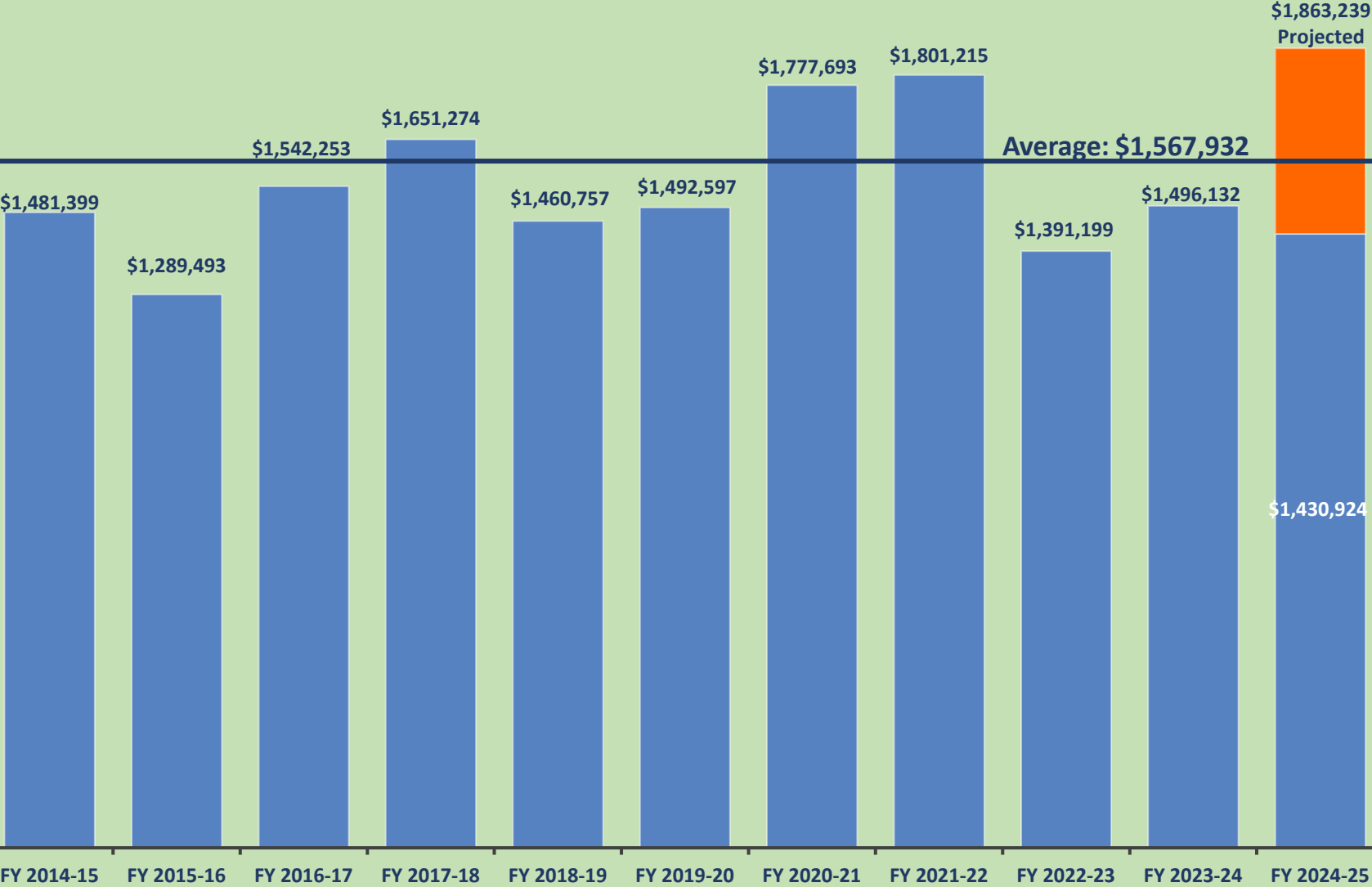
Historical Water Usage By Fiscal Year
